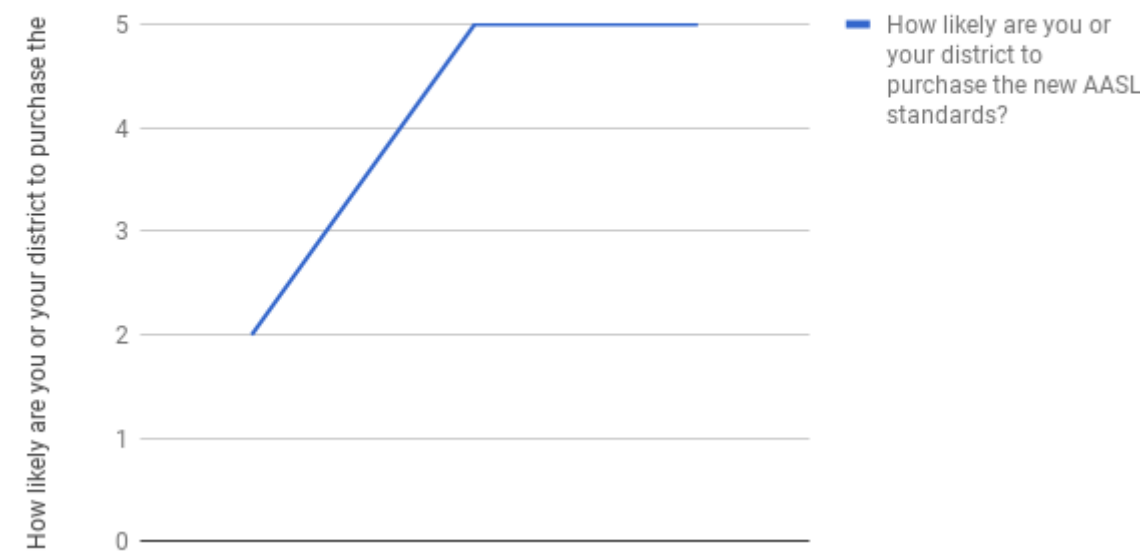
#6 Responses

Here are answers that were received from 3 school librarians in Wyoming.

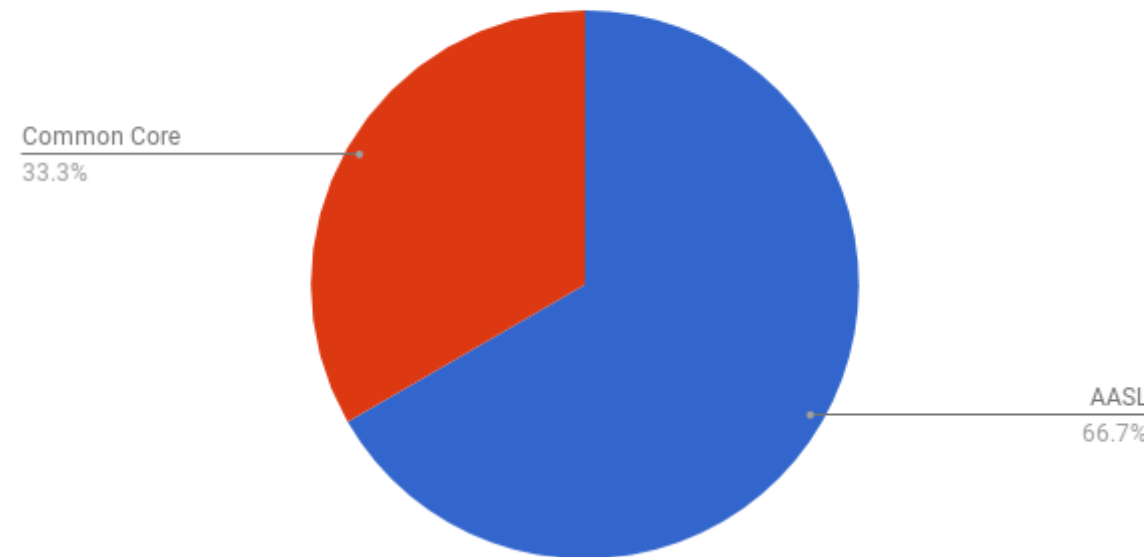
Q1: How likely are you or your district to purchase the new AASL standards?
