State Librarian:

#### WYLD Program Manager:

There has been major progress with testing the alternative solution to VDX for in-system ILL. The WYLD staff will be reaching out soon to a few Wyoming libraries to test on the test server to get feedback. Some exciting new functionality that we are testing is the ability to prevent patrons from renewing ILL materials online as well as limiting the total number of active requests they may have at a time.

#### **Old Business:**

WYLD Annual 2025: Will be held June 12 and 13, 2025. We will arrange for outside catering because CWC will not be able to provide food. Rachel will be sending out save the date emails. WSL office will be getting hotel room blocks set early in January.

Ad Hoc Fee Committee: Lorene reported that they are looking at the current fee formula to see if is still equitable. They will be meeting again after the holidays.

At-large Representative vacancy: Kip has reached out to Karen Horner to see if she will fulfill the rest of the Mel's term and is waiting to hear back from her.

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#### **New Business:**

Rachel recommended that this is the last year that the WYLD Board sign the contract for Candid database and that Library to Business (L2B) needs to find another solution. The way this is set up is that the contract needs to be signed before funds are secured. Natrona and Teton Counties each contributed \$3,000 to the total costs, but Teton County probably won't again unless the usage dramatically increases.
