Wyoming School Libraries Survey 2007-08

Introduction

In the spring of 2008, the Wyoming State Library conducted a survey of Wyoming high school library media centers (LMCs) to gather baseline information on staffing, collections, budgets and other basic measures of inputs and services for the 2007-08 school year.

For this survey, high schools were defined as any school that served the grade 12 population, whether the school served K-12, Junior/Senior High (6-12 or 7-12) or Senior High (9-12 or 10-12). Data has been presented throughout this document sorted by these three types of schools.

The Wyoming Department of Education's (WDE) online schools directory on the agency's website at <http://www.k12.wy.us/>, lists 83 schools serving grade 12 in the state's 48 school districts. Efforts were made to contact all 83 schools to determine if they had a library media center and, if so, to encourage them to participate in the survey. For this survey, a school library media center is defined as having all four of the following:

1. An organized collection of printed, audio-visual and/or other library materials;
2. Paid staff;
3. Designated facilities, and
4. An established schedule where it is available to students, teachers and administrators.

Participating schools

Sixty-one high schools in 44 school districts responded to the survey; 44 schools in 35 districts completed the survey fully, and the remaining schools gave at least partial data.

Of the 61 schools providing data, 39 were Senior High Schools (grades 9-12 or 10-12), 10 were Junior/Senior High Schools (grades 6-12 or 7-12) and 12 were K-12 schools. Only four school districts had no reporting schools: Fremont 38, Niobrara 1, Platte 1 and Washakie 2.

School enrollments were taken from Wyoming Department of Education (WDE) data for Oct. 1, 2007. The schools responding to this survey served 25,281 students, or 29.5% of Wyoming's K-12 fall 2007 public school enrollment. Average school enrollment was 414, and the median was 243. School size ranged from 79 students to 1,611; both the largest and the smallest were Senior High Schools.

Senior Highs were the largest schools on average. There were 20,884 students enrolled in the 39 reporting Senior High Schools. Average enrollment was 535, and the median was 425. Enrollment ranged from 79 to 1,611.

Combined Junior/Senior High Schools had the smallest student bodies. There were 1,583 students enrolled in the 10 reporting Junior/Senior High Schools. Average enrollment was 158, and the median was 149. Enrollment ranged from 80 to 265.

There were 2,814 students enrolled in the 12 reporting K-12 schools. Average enrollment was 234, and the median was 205. Enrollment ranged from 98 to 549.

School library staffing

Staff Positions

Respondents reported that 113 employees worked in the 61 reporting high school libraries during the 2007-08 school year. This included:

- 45 certified library media specialists,
- 9 teachers, and
- 3 workers holding an American Library Association-accredited MLS (ALA-MLS) but no teaching certificate.

Respondents also reported 41 full-time non-certified employees and 20 part-time non-certified employees working in Wyoming school libraries. (Totals are as reported, not calculated, and may not equal the number of individual positions reported.)

In 45 of the 61 reporting schools (73.8%), the library manager held certification as a library media specialist (LMS). Senior High Schools were most likely to report that the manager had LMS certification (33 out of 39, or 84.6%), followed by K-12 schools (8 of 12, or 67%). Combined Junior/Senior High Schools had the lowest percentage of LMS managers, with only 4 out of 10 (40%) reporting certification.

Additional responsibilities

Most Wyoming school library media center staff were responsible for AV equipment, particularly in Senior High Schools. More than one-third oversee a technology lab. Nearly one-fifth are responsible for Library Media Centers in other school buildings.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTEs)

The Wyoming Department of Education (WDE) provided school-level data on professional Library Media (LIM) staff and non-professional Library Media Aide (LMA) full-time equivalent (FTE) positions for the 2007-08 school year. There were a total of 34.79 LIM FTEs and 42.89 aide FTEs. These FTE totals may not include persons who work in the school library media center, but are not formally classified as LIM or LMA.

“I have been a librarian in NJ, NY and MT. Wyoming apparently has no state mandated standards for school library centers either for staff qualifications or for materials available per student, etc. Therefore, school districts do not need to pay a certified position and can use classified staffing. This deprives students of needed information seeking skill instruction and quality materials chosen by a teaching professional.”

Hours and use

On average, high school library media centers were open 40.79 hours per week, with 7.27 of those hours outside of the normal school day. Combined junior/senior high schools were open the fewest hours (39.25) and the fewest hours outside of the school day (4.98). K-12 schools were open longest: 41.61 hours per week. The average of K-12 hours outside the school day (10 hours) is skewed due to Fort Washakie Charter

School, which does not hold conventional classes. Senior high schools averaged 40.95 open hours, 7.15 outside the normal school day.

Some libraries reported daily hours, rather than weekly, and the data has been adjusted. A full explanation is in the notes.

In an average week, 55 schools reported a total of 25,162 student visits to the library media center, or an average of 1.1 visits per student. The majority (16,453, or 65.4%) were students who used the library as part of a formal, scheduled class session. The remainder (8,722) were visits by students using the library independently, either alone or in groups.

Instructional hours

Colorado’s Library Research Service has conducted and compiled numerous school library impact studies showing that student achievement improves when the school employs certified school library media professionals who work collaboratively with teachers to deliver instruction (<http://www.lrs.org/impact.php>).

To assess how LMCs deliver instruction, the Wyoming School Library Survey asked how many hours in an average week the library staff collaborated with teachers to plan instructional units and how many hours they actively delivered instruction.

Respondents in 54 libraries reported they spend an average of 4.34 hours delivering instruction. School library staff spend an average of 1.65 hours meeting with teachers to plan instructional units. School library media centers see an average 4.8 scheduled class sessions weekly, or 243 sessions weekly in all reporting libraries.

In Wyoming school libraries, instructional sessions and hours tended to be fluid, based on the school year cycle and the needs of both students and teachers, making it difficult to report a weekly total. Individual library instructional hours and sessions vary widely. Some libraries serve up to 20 to 30 classes a week, while others report no sessions. Instructional hours range from zero to 40, and hours spent planning units collaboratively with teachers range from zero to 20. The medians are much lower: one hour meeting with teachers weekly, two hours spent actively delivering instruction and two scheduled class sessions.

“I have no such thing as an “average” week!”

“The teachers do not feel that they can take time to do library instruction because they need to meet all the standards and complete a long list of assessments.”

Circulation

Forty-five schools, with a combined enrollment of 18,731 students, provided library circulation data. These schools circulated a total of 281,990 items for the 2007-08 school year, approximately 15 items per student.

Respondents were also asked which automated circulation system they used. The two most commonly used circulation systems were Alexandria (14 users of 56 reporting schools) and Follett (13 users).

Electronic resources

The average school had 25 to 26 Internet-access computers available for student use in the library media center. This number was highest in high schools (28.7), but these schools also had higher enrollments. The average number of Internet computers per 100 students in all schools was 5.9, and the median was 5.6.

Most schools reported that their school had a web site, and the school web site had links to WYLD (Wyoming Libraries Database) resources. Many of the comments under electronic resources stressed the importance of the WYLD databases at GoWYLD.net. Schools reported they rely on these heavily:

“We only have databases provided by GoWYLD. Our budget doesn't allow for purchase of others.”

“The databases that we have access to through GoWYLD are a critical component of our resources overall. We would be critically underfunded without these resources.”

Nearly half of schools reported purchasing additional databases for use by their students. The two most popular were Discovery Education Streaming (United Streaming) and NoodleTools.

Collections

Forty-nine schools provided statistics on their collections. These 49 schools hold more than half a million print items, an average of 24.8 per student. These schools also held 19,609 audio-video materials and 1,428 serial subscriptions.

Expenditures

Forty-five schools provided data on collection expenditures. These schools reported spending \$491,919 in 2007-08 on their collections, an average of \$24.52 per student. Of total collection expenditures, 53% (\$260,485) was spent on print materials. There were wide disparities in the amount spent on collections per student, ranging from under \$10 to more than \$100.

Schools spent more than \$55,000 on licensed databases, although some libraries indicated that database purchases went through the school district and did not appear in the budgets they reported here.

Data collection on total operating expenditures proved to be problematic for reasons explained in the “Notes on the Data” section, and is inconsistent. It is presented here as reported.

Notes on the data

General notes

- Not all libraries completed the survey. Where items are reported as number of schools responding, non-responses may affect the total.
- Averages and medians do not include data from non-reporting schools.

Staff positions and credentials: Total number of staff is presented as reported, and may not total the number of individual positions reported.

Staffing FTEs: Data provided by the Wyoming Department of Education includes staff FTEs designated as LIM (Library Media Professional) and LMA (Library Media Aide). Staff who work in the library, but are not LIM or LMA, may be excluded.

Hours and use

- Some respondents reported daily hours. Responses of 10 hours or less for total hours were assumed to be daily and were multiplied based on 4-day and 5-day schedules listed in the Wyoming Libraries Directory.
- Where “Hours while classes not in session” was equal to or greater than “LMC open & staffed hours,” the “not in session” data was deleted, unless explanatory notes were included.
- Where the school reported open hours, but left “Hours while classes not in session” blank, the latter was assumed to be zero.
- Where hours were reported under “Hours while classes not in session,” but not under total hours, this was assumed to be total hours.
- Although the intent was to collect data on when the library was open to students, some respondents reported hours that the LMC was staffed, but was not open to students. This will be clarified in the 2008-09 survey.

- One school provided total student visit figures, but no breakdown of scheduled and independent visits. The breakdown was imputed for use in the averages, totals and medians, but the imputed data is not displayed.

Circulation

- Some libraries completed the survey prior to the end of the school year, and reported circulation as of the date they submitted the survey, not for the full school year. Others used 2006-07 figures.
- One library reported that students take books without officially checking them out, skewing circulation figures.

Collections: Where libraries provided data for one or more material types, but left others blank, blank responses were assumed to be zero.

Expenditures

- As with collections, where expenditures were reported for one or more material types, blank responses were assumed to be zero.
- In general, total expenditure numbers are presented as reported. Where the library gave expenditures for one or more material types, but did not provide a number for total expenditures, that number was calculated.
- Total operating expenditures – materials, staffing and other – proved to be particularly problematic to collect, as individual libraries often did not have budget figures for all items, and did not report all items. No totals, averages or medians are given for total expenditures. Data collection issues on expenditures will be addressed in the planning for the 2008-09 survey.

Respondent comments

Staffing: responsibilities

Senior high schools

- Help with District office needs and WEN Coordinator
- There is a lab of 12 computers in the library
- lab in library

Junior/senior high schools

- 18 in LMC computers
- Responsible for another library in our K-12 building.
- The computers are located within the LMC not a separate room. There is no storage; consequently, all AV equipment has been moved to the individual classrooms.

K-12 schools

- Reading program administration
- Library--and hence staff--serve both the school and the public.

Staffing: general comments

Senior high schools

- Library media specialist is assigned to this alternative high school, with 60 students enrolled, 1 day out of 6; 1 K-4 elementary school, with 450 students, 4 days out of 6; 1 K-8 school with 85 students, 1 day out of 6.
- Our elementary LMC are staffed by non-certified technicians. We have one certified LMS that is responsible for all elementary libraries (20-25)

- One aide and one district library media spec. for the district (3 schools/3 libraries)
- We are not replacing a retiring LMC person at the middle school
- For answer number 7, the LMC staff is responsible for 2 schools - 1 alternate, 1 elementary

Junior/senior high schools

- I am a certified SLMS, but the position is "library assistant"

K-12 schools

- 1 K-12 librarian for Elementary, Jr. High and HS 1 part time aide at elementary 1 part time aide at jr/HS
- We also serve pre-k, Headstart and the general public.
- I am currently working on my SLMS endorsement. I have 9 more hours to take. I work .5 in library.
- I could not enter an accurate number for certified staff. I work as a librarian half time rather than full time. The state recommends a full-time position.
- Our whole district is just one K-12 school, so we're responsible for an entire district but not for multiple schools.

Hours and use

Senior high schools

- Numbers of students vary each week depending on class size and project. There is also a variance on numbers coming in individual and in groups depending on deadlines.
- #11 totals are not broken down this way. I keep total # of students using media center including classes and individuals.

- There are only 97 students in the HS and almost every class is in the Library weekly.
- This library operates on a flexible schedule. Exact hours and use are hard to determine so I have just estimated. Library use is centered around the needs of students and teachers. These needs vary from one day/one week to the next.
- There may be some weeks no groups visit, however, there are weeks that all of a teacher's classes visit to do research.
- The computer lab in the library is used frequently by the teachers to bring in classes.
- Classes come in to do research as per schedules with teachers. Science classes use the LMC the most.
- Building principal and secretaries all open the library in an "as needed" manner. If materials are needed and I am out of the building, they will do what they can for the patron.
- I don't keep exact statistics on this so is a guesstimate.

Junior/senior high schools

- Only 300 students in school, many come daily. We have a four day week.
- Our non-school hours are a tutoring, detention, and student assistance program located in the library.

K-12 schools

- Our high school doesn't hold conventional classes, rather on-line education is our clarion call.
- I keep the library open at all times since that is a high priority goal.

Instructional hours

Senior high schools

- Reported time is for the high school only. I have regularly weekly scheduled library classes at both elementary schools.
- Hours really depend on what a teacher needs for a particular class, whether they are researching or just typing - some want more help and some would rather instruct their own students - sometimes the numbers above are less depending on what other events are taking place - they are really an average of good and bad weeks.
- It is hard to determine these times because some weeks I am really busy, and other weeks not at all.
- #14 is not related to Information Literacy instruction. I teach 2 classes of video production.
- District librarian duties have changed so the amount of time spent instructing has changed during the past 2 years.
- Classroom teachers are responsible for instruction. LMC staff will do general orientation and how to log into computers and databases. We also assist teachers on how to do specific things in Word or Powerpoint but do not generally teach classes.
- Again, this all depends on the needs of the classroom teachers and the material that will be covered. Some weeks are busier than others such as when research papers are being done.
- Our library doesn't keep statistics on the information covered in items #13, 14, and 15 (instructional hours). We spend many hours helping individual students with a wide variety of questions and problems. I don't have any statistics, but I know that students are able to get help here.
- Teachers accompany their students to the library for instruction.
- At the beginning of the year I do a library orientation for all classes, but I don't have classes that I teach on a regular basis.

- Instruction is delivered to individual students on a need basis or at teacher request.
- Once in a great while we are asked to do database training or research training.
- I have no such thing as an "average" week!
- I only work with teachers periodically depending on the need. So it isn't so much per week.

Junior/senior high schools

- I constantly help students get books, with computer glitches and websites, etc, but do not collaborate, as it is not a teaching position yet.
- Instruction is only about 10 hours per year
- The Librarian has a reading group each day that she takes during the school scheduled reading times.
- The library media specialist's instructional hours are spent teaching sixth grade classes because I am a teacher/librarian.
- The teachers do not feel that they can take time to do library instruction because they need to meet all the standards and complete a long list of assessments.

K-12 schools

- I also teach a class outside the library 55 minutes each day. Into this time I have to factor planning time. Total of 1 hour and 30 minutes daily out of library for this class totaling 7.5 hours a week outside of the library to teach a class unrelated to the library. That is 1 day a week that I am not in the library.
- I've done official library instruction with three different groups this year, for 30-60 minutes each--enough to say we're doing instruction, but not enough to make up a weekly average.

Circulation

Senior high schools

- Counters had not been reset, thus, used an average
- Circulation total is current as of the day this survey was submitted.
- This is last year's circulation number.

Combined junior/senior high schools

- A majority of the books in the book drop have been borrowed by students and staff, but they were not checked out officially.

K-12 schools

- Based on our total circulation as of May 5, 2008
- The total circulation is for K-12.

Electronic resources

Senior high schools

- The WYLD databases rock!
- We have two libraries with computers and 1 computer lab hooked to us.
- We use the GoWYLD WSL databases.
- We only have databases provided by GoWYLD. Our budget doesn't allow for purchase of others.
- The databases that we have access to through GoWYLD are a critical component of our resources overall. We would be critically underfunded without these resources.
- Tech Center handles computer resources.

- We are trying to promote the data bases offered on the GoWYLD site. I asked our tech to put a link on our home page, but looks like I need to remind him. Chris has done a couple of webinars for us on our in-service days. She's the best!!
- Students use GoWYLD.
- I find that GoWYLD is sufficient.
- GoWYLD

K-12 schools

- The school district is in the process of creating websites for all of the schools. In time, we will have our library website linked to our school website which will be linked to the district site. We are way, way behind on this.

Collections

Senior high schools

- #27 includes all materials, books, AV, equipment, periodicals
- Other includes 310 calculators, 450 laptop computers and AV equipment. Next year we will circulate and track approx 1500 laptop computers
- AUDIO includes old records which are still used at times, although infrequently. OTHER is slides in sets, mostly science, art, history. Number in each set varies (carousel) average is 40 slides per carousel.
- when I converted it included periodicals into some of my regular collection so that is why I say it is estimated- there were conversion problems

Junior/senior high schools

- I am new this year. I am mandated to delete all items not circulated since 2000. We are building new school and will buy books then. Previous librarian focused on technology. Collection is decades old.

K-12 schools

- These numbers are for materials purchased by the school, but they reflect only a small portion of the resources available to students at the library, most of which are purchased with county money.

Expenditures

Senior high schools

- Other includes tech support, equipment, and supplies
- Did not include salaries of LMS, LIB Tech or Media Specialist in LMCs total.
- This [total expenditures] is a guess.
- Total expenditures include salary, travel, repairs, supplies, print materials, equipment, etc.
- This number [total expenditures] is almost impossible to come up with. In addition to the \$1600 for library materials we also received 8 new computers this year.
- This figure does NOT include personnel. I do not have personnel information except my own. The database expenditures does not come out of my budget. A District budget covers this expense.
- Use school district purchase orders AND Wyoming State Library Acquisitions account.
- 8050 is my total library budget.
- I don't pay for personnel out of my budget, just collections and other expenses. Licensed databases are purchased by our tech center.
- The district pays for our databases. [Total operating expense] is unknown.
- The total in [total operating expense] includes salaries.

K-12 schools

- Our business office has that information in a difficult set of statistics. They don't have them for us until summer
- The "other" column above consists of monies for equipment, supplies, travel and repair. This year's budget is elevated because of trying to "catch up". Next year's budget, which we do not know yet, will be much reduced.
- The figures are somewhat deceptive, since the school also has access to all the materials purchased by the county library.

General comments on the survey

Senior high schools

- If there is a survey next year, I will be better prepared - I actually intended to do it earlier - but forgot - I apologize. Thanks for your time and consideration.
- Collection estimates on numbers of volumes is a guess at best. Probably with more time and greater knowledge of the operation of our circulation program would give a closer number. Classes come to use the facility but not with my direct instruction. The classroom teacher attends and monitors students. I teach 2 periods of the day in a video production lab next to the media center.
- Next year there will be a new library media specialist. I do not know what her credentials are.
- Independence High School is the Alternative High School for Sweetwater School District #1. It was located up at WWCC for over 10 years and was moved to this former Elementary Building after the elementary school was closed 5 years ago. The library collection began as books that were weeded from other school libraries when the schools that were consolidated and reconfigured. We moved the books to a modular behind the main building four years ago. As district Library Department Head, I pushed to be able to

come over once a week and establish a circulation system and for the district to hire a library assistant to be in the library daily. Although we were promised funding for materials it never materialized until this year. I would have book fairs, get small donations and buy from the public library book sales to get books to add to our collection. A+, an online self paced full curriculum program, was purchased and adopted for IHS. With that program we received more computers. The facility is used more as a computer lab. This year is the first year we were actually allocated money out of the General Fund for the purchase of books. I have started a few programs with students. Withe the increase from one day out of six to two days out of six next year (and funding again) I hope to get more going on.

- This year, I was on sick leave for 4 months due to a total knee replacement. My substitute was not familiar with library procedures. Some statistics may not be included in the computer's numbers. Expenditures this year are less than expected due to not ordering as usual and my taking time to get "caught up" in the library and as a senior class sponsor.
- There was no question on the number of students in our school. We have 190 students.
- Material numbers, for us, is not an accurate description of our collection. It includes equipment, calculators, textbooks, etc.
- It is extremely difficult to determine costs when I share them with my two other libraries and you are asking for this school year when it isn't over yet.
- No but this took quite a while to do- pretty time consuming with going back and forth to my library system for stats.

- I have been a librarian in NJ, NY and MT. Wyoming apparently has no state mandated standards for school library centers either for staff qualifications or for materials available per student, etc. Therefore, school districts do not need

to pay a certified position and can use classified staffing. This deprives students of needed information seeking skill instruction and quality materials chosen by a teaching professional.

K-12 schools

- We are in the process of trying to establish a reasonable budget for the coming years based on state averages for same-size schools.
