How LSTA Funds Benefit Wyoming

The Wyoming State Library is granted federal funds every year from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) through the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA). Over the past five years, Wyoming library patrons and staff have benefited from LSTA funds that total over \$4,918,000.

LSTA dollars are used to connect patrons with library materials in both print and electronic formats. All Wyoming residents have access to LSTA-funded purchases

through their local school, public, or academic library.
