



Pre-filing Season Outreach



Ready to file your tax return? Check out our Tax Tips to avoid IRS delays. Pass "go" with confidence.



Use your Form W-2, not your pay stub, to verify your income.

IRS Integrity and Verification Operations


 What: The IRS compares income and withholding reported on your tax return to Forms W-2 and other information returns.

Why:

- To ensure that accurate returns are processed.
- Helps identify fraudulent returns before refunds are issued.



Double check that your information is correct for you and your dependents.



Attach all required forms and schedules before you submit your return.

Economic Impact Payments / Recovery Rebate Credit

- Recovery Rebate Credit

If no Economic Impact Payment was received (or it was not the correct amount) in 2020, you must now claim it as a Recovery Rebate Credit on your Form 1040, Individual Income Tax Return or Form 1040-SR, U.S. Tax Return for Seniors.

Premium Tax Credit

- Form 8962, *Premium Tax Credit*, must be submitted, if the Premium Tax Credit is being claimed.
 - Use Form 1095-A, Health Insurance Marketplace Statement, to complete Form 8962.
- All tax returns will be stopped during processing if the credit is claimed but the Form 8962 is not attached.

You need a Form 1098-T, Tuition Statement, from an eligible educational institution to claim education expenses.



Be aware of tax software that imports **prior year** data automatically.

Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) Requirements

- Always check the income limits first or use the <u>EITC Assistant</u> tool
- Must have SSNs for all qualifying children before due date of return (including extensions)
- Filing status: MFJ, HOH, QW or Single—No MFS
- U. S. Citizen or Resident Alien
- Can't file Form 2555 or Form 2555-EZ and claim credit
- Meet rules for those without a qualifying child OR have a qualifying child

2020 Income limits

Qualifying Children Claimed

If filing	Zero	One	Two	Three
Single, Head of Household, or Widowed	\$15,820	\$41,756	\$47,440	\$50,954
Married Filing Jointly	\$21,710	\$47,646	\$53,330	\$56,844

Investment Income Limit

Investment income must be \$3,650 or less for the year.

Maximum Credit Amounts

The maximum amount of credit for Tax Year 2020 is:

- \$6,660 with three or more qualifying children
- \$5,920 with two qualifying children
- \$3,584 with one qualifying child
- \$538 with no qualifying children.

Earned Income Tax Credit Income Limits and Maximum Credit Amounts

Common EITC Errors

- Claiming a child who does not meet residency or relationship requirements
- Reporting income or expenses, particularly on Schedule C, incorrectly
- Filing as single or head of household when married
- Name and Social Security number errors



What We Do


TAS works in two main ways:





What Else Does TAS Do?
